	5	Complete a presentation about Vikings. Include as much information as you can and use drawings and pictures to support your writing.	Create a fact file on a country of your choice from around the world. Include the continent, the flag, and its location in the world.	Write a play script of a familiar story, showing speech between two characters.	Choose an artist who uses the medium of watercolour paint. Find out about them, and find examples of their work, and write your response. Do you like their work? Why?
	4	Find a picture of an interesting setting. It might be a forest, a cave, a seascape or the craters of the moon! Describe the setting in detail, using adjectives and other descriptive language. 	Research, draw and label an electric circuit. Make sure it is a complete circuit so that it will work!	Make up a rap of your own - if you are brave you might want to perform it to the class.	Create and illustrate a food chain. Remember to make sure the animals and plant life share the same habitat. Show the transfer of energy using arrows. 
	3	Create a prayer - it does not need to be religious or to a particular god. What are you thankful for? What help would you ask for? What do you feel it is important to remember?	Create your own maths word problems using money. You could use addition, subtraction, multiplication or division, or a mixture of all. Don't forget to include the answers!	Write a book review of a book you have read recently. Would you recommend it to a friend, and why? What was your favourite part?	Try to learn a magic trick. You could learn a card trick, make something disappear, or reappear! Maybe you could learn to juggle? Look on the internet, or watch a YouTube clip and practice until you are ready to perform your trick to an audience.
	2	Imagine you are in a foreign country. Write a postcard home to a friend. Describe the differences between this country and England.	Research, draw and label ten flags from around the world. Design your own flag, including something significant to you within the design.	List items from around your house that use electricity. Can you divide them into the types of electricity they use? (mains, batteries, solar power, etc.)	Find out as much as you can about 3D shapes. Draw them as accurately as you can, and write about their properties. Include: how many faces (flat sides), how many vertices (corners), how many edges? 
	1	How many push ups can you do in a row? Challenge a family member - who can do the most? Can you beat the record?	Write a New Year's Resolution for yourself. It could be related to school, home or friendships.	Shades of meaning - create a chart of synonyms (words that mean the same as each other) and put in order of extremity. E.g. tepid, warm, hot, boiling, scorching.	Draw and label the birds that you see in your garden/outside your home. Which is the most frequent visitor?
